Kirsten has an interest in orthopedics with a certificate in equine orthopedics. Kirsten really enjoys meeting new clients and the variety of general practice work.

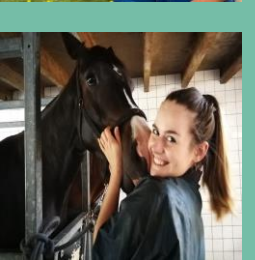
When she is not working Kirsten enjoys family time, walking her dogs and socializing with friends.

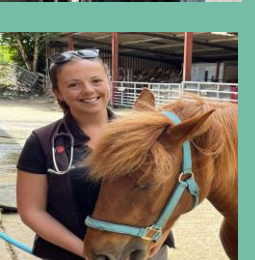
During her down time Louisa enjoys riding her horse, playing rugby and walking with her dog.
