




Our nursing team are extremely important in the everyday running of the practice. They admit and dismiss animals to and from the hospital for operations, care for in-patients and monitor animals under sedation and general anaesthesia.

Our qualified, registered nurses also run surgeries daily at our main Hythe hospital and twice weekly at Lymington branch. They are happy to discuss all areas of parasite control, weight management, adolescent health, dental care and general well being of your pet. Nurses also carry out post operative checks, suture removals, blood sampling, some vaccinations, microchipping, dressing changes, claw clipping, de-matting and grooming. Flea, worm, weight and adolescent consultations are free of charge with a nurse, and claw clipping is offered at a reduced cost.

Several of our nurses also have special interests, which include cat and dog behaviour and rabbit health and welfare. Puppy socialisation classes are also run at the Hythe hospital by Colleen Walker.

Seadown is a nurse training practice, which means we have student nurses who train 'on the job' whilst attending college once a week. Nurse training takes three years to complete, and is a demanding combination of coursework, practical assessments and written examinations. Many of the nurses, who train with us decide to continue their career with Seadown.
